

Clashes with European soldiers, rioting, looting and slaughter marked the fall of Shanghai, principal port of Thina, into the hands of Cantonese troops. While the Cantonese troops were for the most part poorly clad and equipped, there were many of the type shown in the upper photograph. Men of all ages were in the ranks including such boys as the young color bearer shown at the left. The lower photograph shows a barricade thrown up before a European concession to prevent camp followers from looting the district. Thousands of Americans and Europeans were ready for an open clash with the Cantonese if necessary. All were under the command of Admiral C. S. Williams (inset), United States navy, who was ranking officer on the scene.

Washington, D. C., March 26 (UP)-Alarmed by spreading anti-foreign activity in China, President Coolidge today ordered more than 1500 more American marines sent to the war zone to protect 1,000 of United States nationals potentially menaced there. The leathernecks mobilizing with wartime speed at half a dozen Atlantic coast recently journeyed to Nebraska to points, will sail from San Diego, Cal., study operations of the law.
